In line with Vertaria Green's ambitions to develop their landscaping business in a responsible manner, they are providing services to the Bucharest Blind & Deaf School on a pro-bono basis.

Vertaria Green is providing design and supervision services to start the renovation and modernisation of a landscaped sensory garden which allows the students who have either impaired vision or hearing to appreciate the sights, sounds and smells of a beautiful natural environment.

Careful arrangement and layout together with well researched selection of bushes and plants will provide a stimulating, but at the same time restful, location around the school which can be used for teaching or free time.

The renovation started in the summer of 2005 on the lay out originally designed and set out by Queen Elisabeta, first queen of Romania, in 1908.

Captain Stan Platt, Chairman of Light into Europe a charity which supports the school, was delighted with the professionalism and organisation of Vertaria Green.
